FIRST: The name of the corporation is Southern Arizona AIDS Foundation.

SECOND: PURPOSE. This organization is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of §501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended from time to time ("Code").

The corporation shall only conduct activities permitted to be conducted by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Code §501(c)(3), or by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Code §170(c)(2). Within the foregoing restrictions, the corporation intends to conduct activities which assist in the care and support of those living with HIV, and their families, and to act as a supporting organization for the following organizations which are all organizations exempt from federal income tax under Code §501(c)(3): Shanti Foundation of Tucson, Inc., the Troy Stephenson Foundation dba. PACT for Life, and the Tucson AIDS Project, Inc.

THIRD: The statutory agent for the corporation is: Douglas J. Newman; Douglas J. Newman, P.C.; 1717 N. Tucson Blvd., Tucson, Arizona, 85716.

FOURTH: The initial three-person board, to serve until the first annual election of directors or until their successors are elected and qualified, are:

FIFTH: No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation may pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Second.


SIXTH: Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law) or (b) by a corporation contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law).

SEVENTH: Upon the dissolution of this corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding section of any future tax code), or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

EIGHTH: The personal liability of the directors of the corporation to the corporation (and to members, if applicable) for monetary damages for breach of

fiduciary duty as a director shall be limited or eliminated to the fullest extent allowable by law.

Your fiscal year end is 12/31. A preprinted Annual Report Form will be mailed to you during that month.
